Water, sewer, and trash pick up- is furnished through the City of Moscow Mills. A \$150.00 deposit is required for these services. Water, Sewer and Trash is billed monthly and is due by the 15th of each month. If your bill is not paid by the 15th a penalty will result, and if not paid by the 23rd disconnection will result on the next business day along with a \$50.00 disconnection fee. You can sign up at moscowmillsmo.com to receive your bill by e-mail and/or pay online.

Trash and recycling is picked up on Wednesday. Your totes must be taken out to the edge of your lot by 6:00 a.m. for the trash company to pick them up. Only totes provided by Christian Disposal will be picked up. Yard wastes will **not** be picked up with your trash. Yard waste can be brought to City Hall for disposal during business hours.

White goods-White goods are items such as washers, dryers, water heaters, refrigerators, stoves, air conditioners, and microwaves. These items can be brought to City Hall during normal business hours for disposal. There is no charge for city residents, and a \$2.00 per item charge for non-city residents. The door **MUST** be removed from refrigerators and freezers. Please stop at City Hall for instructions on dropping the item off.

The City does not accept mattresses or furniture. Pickup of these items would have to be arranged through Christian Disposal, and any additional charges will appear on your monthly bill from the City.

City meetings-Board of Aldermen meetings are held on the second Monday of the month, 6:30 p.m. Planning and Zoning Commission meetings are held on the first Monday of the month, 6:00 p.m. Meetings are held at the Moscow Mills Community Building, 625 Hwy C. Anyone is welcome to attend.

Noteworthy City Ordinances:

Pet license tags-On the first day of January of each year, the owner of each dog or cat, then over the age of six months, kept within the City, and for each dog or cat then or thereafter in the City, on attaining six months of age during the year shall secure from the City Clerk a license tag for such dog or cat, which license tag shall be issued upon payment of a three dollar (\$3.00) fee. A written statement briefly describing such dog or cat sought to be registered and naming the alleged owner thereof, signed by a duly licensed veterinarian who shall certify that such dog or cat has been immunized against rabies is required. The owner shall keep the tag securely fastened by means of a collar about the neck of the dog or cat at all times. In addition, if the tag supplied by the City does not contain the owner's name and address, the owner shall fasten another tag with this information thereon.

Kennel License-Any person keeping more than two animals shall be required to have a kennel license. The kennel license fee shall be \$15.00 per year.

Leashing requirements. It shall be unlawful for any person or persons owning, controlling, harboring, possessing or having the management or care, in whole or in part, of any dog or cat, to permit such dog or cat to run at large. For the purpose of this ordinance, every dog or cat when on any street, alley or other public place in the City of Moscow Mills, which is not attached to a leash, the other end of which is securely held by a competent person, or when on private property within said City, which is either not attached to a leash, the other end of which is securely held by a competent person, or which is not so confined as to prevent its straying from the premises, shall be deemed running at large; provided, however, that a dog or cat bearing an identification tag containing the name and address of its owner and a current city license tag securely fastened to a collar about the neck of such animal may remain in an enclosure on the property of its owner without leash or other confinement.

Impounded pets-The redemption fee shall be Fifteen (\$15.00) dollars for the first time any dog or cat is impounded, Twenty five (\$25.00)dollars for the second time such dog or cat is impounded and Fifty(\$50.00) dollars for each time thereafter such dog or cat is impounded. This schedule shall apply to any sixty (60) consecutive month period. Plus, the owner shall pay Five (\$5.00) dollars per day, each day, or partial day thereof the dog or cat is impounded. If the animal is not redeemed within five (5) days (excluding Sundays and Holidays) after his capture, such animal shall be destroyed.

House numbers-Such numbers shall be of such size and in such location to be visible from the nearest street. Address numbers shall be a minimum of three (3) inches in height and shall be located either near a building's main entrance or on a surface that is easily visible from the nearest street. Additional displays of assigned numbers may be displayed at the property owners discretion. Assigned numbers shall be displayed with arabic numerals in a color that contrasts with the color of the subject house or building. Address displays in script are prohibited if used exclusively. Houses or buildings that are setback more than one hundred (100) feet from a street's curb shall be required to display address numbers within fifty (50) feet of the street curb.

Curfew-Loitering of minors prohibited. It shall be unlawful for any minor under the age of eighteen (18) years to loiter, idle, wander, stroll, drive, or play in or upon the public streets, highways, roads, alleys, playgrounds, parks, public buildings, or to attend or frequent places of amusement, places where refreshments are served, drinking emporiums, taverns and other unsupervised public places, between the hours of 10 p.m. and 6 a.m. of the following day, central standard time of Sunday through Thursday and from 12 midnight to 6 a.m. on Friday and Saturday, provided however, that the provisions of this section do not apply to a minor accompanied by his or her parent, guardian or other adult person having the care and custody of the minor (or where the minor is upon an emergency errand of legitimate business directed by his or her parent, guardian or other adult person having the care and custody of the minor). Each violation of the provisions of this section shall constitute a separate offense.

No Visit List. The city clerk shall maintain a list of persons within the city who restrict visits to their residential property (including their leasehold, in the case of a tenant) by solicitors. The issuing officer may provide a form to assist residents, and this form may allow the resident to select certain types of visits that the resident finds acceptable while refusing permission to others. This "no visit" list shall be a public document and available for public inspection and copying. A copy of the "no visit" list shall be provided to each applicant for and each recipient of a solicitor's permit. (Please note: All solicitors must be registered with City Hall and have a City License in their possession. If someone comes to your door soliciting and does not have a City issued license please contact the Moscow Mills Police Department.)

Building Codes and Zoning-The City of Moscow Mills has regulations on both building codes and zoning. Please contact City Hall or visit our website to see if a permit or application is required before proceeding with any building or new use of your land.

WASTE COLLECTION PROCEDURES: All waste must be placed curbside by 6:00 a.m. Automated arms are used to lift the waste receptacles. Because of the mechanics of the automated arms, waste containers must be placed a minimum of three feet from any standing object to avoid damage. This includes mailboxes, automobiles, and also other waste containers. Three feet of clear space must surround the container on all sides. The container must also be less than three feet away from the street curb. ***Please note that there is a one dollar charge for each bag disposed of that is not inside the Toter.

Regular trash and Recycling is picked up on Wednesday of each week, unless there is a holiday. See holiday schedule below.

PROHIBITED ITEMS INCLUDE

- Construction Material, Syringes or any medical waste, Batteries, Paint, Hazardous Materials, Tires, Car parts/fluids
- Appliances (Appliances cannot be collected with household waste.)
You may call Customer Service to arrange a Bulk Pick Up for appliances.
- Compost
- **Remember that yard waste, such as leaves, branches, grass clippings, or flowers cannot be disposed of in household waste. It is against Federal Regulations.**

RECYCLING CONSISTS OF:

- CARDBOARD
- CONTAINERS – must be rinsed and labels removed.
 - Aluminum, steel or tin cans.
 - #1, #2, #3, #4, #5, #6, #7 and #8 natural or colored plastic containers.
 - NOTE: Caps must be removed from plastic bottles/containers.
- FIBER
 - Newspaper, magazines, junk mail, office paper.
 - Tissue boxes, Cereal boxes

NOT ACCEPTED ITEMS: Heavy metals, Car parts, Rubber products, Wood products, Styrofoam or PS #6

HOLIDAYS

CHRISTIAN DISPOSAL observes six holidays: New Years Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving and Christmas. If a holiday falls during a normal work week (Monday – Friday) and the holiday falls on or before your pick up day, your pick up will be one day later than normally scheduled.
