



6:00 p.m.-Mayor Flannigan calls the meeting to order. Steve Aston, Alderman Ward I; Tom Gormley, Alderman Ward I; Gerald Green, Alderman Ward II, and Cody Quist Alderman, Ward II are present. Also in attendance is Linda Haynes, City Clerk. Cindy Davenport, City Attorney, is absent.

Cody Quist makes a motion to adjourn to executive session per RSMo. 610.021 #1-Legal and #2-Real Estate. Gerald Green seconds the motion. Roll call vote is as follows: Steve Aston-Aye, Tom Gormley-Aye, Gerald Green-Aye, Cody Quist-Aye.

Executive session is held and adjourned.

Terry Foster, Chief of Police; Rob Hamilton, Public Works Superintendent, and A.J. Girondo, City Engineer are now in attendance. There is one guest in attendance.

In re: Pledge of Allegiance & Moment of Silence-Mayor Flannigan leads the Pledge of Allegiance and then a moment of silence is held.

In re: Remarks of Visitors-There is no one signed up to speak.

In re: Approval of Consent Agenda items-Jerry Green makes a motion to approve the consent agenda items which includes minutes from the April 14th, 18th (corrected), and 28th Board of Aldermen meetings; financial reports; paid bills report; bills to pay report; Department Head reports from the Court Clerk, City Clerk, Utility Superintendent, and Chief of Police; and Judge Patrick Coyne to attend the MMACJA Conference May 25-27th at Lake Ozark. Tom Gormley seconds the motion. Roll call vote is as follows: Steve Aston-Aye, Tom Gormley-Aye, Jerry Green-Aye, Cody Quist-Aye.

In re: Updates, repairs, etc. at water and sewer treatment plants & lift stations-Rob Hamlin gives an update on the projects. A project status report is included with his consent agenda items. Tom Gormley asks why the gallons of sewer are so much more than the gallons of water pumped. Rob Hamlin explains that inflow and infiltration causes this when it rains. They look at the lines with cameras, do smoke testing, and other items to try to reduce it. After meeting with his crew, he has determined that most of the time spent on the step system repairs is due to wiring issues or pumps burning up. Regular wire connectors have been used in the past. They will start using direct bury connectors, which should reduce these issues. The design on Hwy MM and Hwy C water lines are in the process of being done.

In re: Well #5 project update-A.J. Girondo states that they should be ready in a week to apply to Mo DNR and determine what easements will be needed.

In re: MML Elected Officials Training-anyone to attend?-June 9-10, 2022-Steve Aston states that he will let the City Clerk know by Friday if he will be able to attend this training.



In re: Ordinance #999-Amending the 2022 budget-Linda Haynes reads the title of Ordinance #999 in full two times. Cody Quist makes a motion to approve Ordinance #999. Jerry Green seconds the motion. Roll call vote is as follows: Steve Aston-Aye, Tom Gormley-Aye, Jerry Green-Aye, Cody Quist-Aye.

In re: Cell phone policy discussion-Mayor Flannigan states that there were some employees who were inquiring about using their personal cell phone and receiving a monthly stipend, rather than carrying a second phone issued by the City. The Sunshine Law was explained to them as it relates to city business and open records. They have decided they did not want to pursue this any further.

In re: Request to have City Hall's lawn mowing contracted out-Mayor Flannigan states that the Maintenance Department is having a hard time getting things done. One thing that would save them some time is the mowing at City Hall. A bid has been obtained from Palmyra Professional Lawn Management to mow City Hall weekly through the end of this year for \$175.00 per week. Following some discussion, Cody Quist makes a motion to hire Palmyra Professional Lawn Management to mow City Hall through the end of the year and allow the Mayor to sign any appropriate paperwork for the mowing. Tom Gormley seconds the motion. All are in favor.

Tom Gormley states that he forgot that he had a correction regarding the April 18, 2022 minutes that were approved this evening. They state that he voted for the walking trails, but his vote was Nay. Cody Quist makes a motion to amend the agenda to reconsider the approval of the April 18, 2022 minutes. Jerry Green seconds the motion. All are in favor.

In re: Reconsider April 18, 2022 Board meeting minutes-Tom Gormley states that his vote on page four of the minutes regarding the walking trails should have been a Nay. Tom Gormley makes a motion to approve the April 18, 2022 meeting minutes with his vote amended to state Nay regarding the walking trails. Cody Quist seconds the motion. All are in favor.

Mayor Flannigan states that a second executive session is not needed this evening.

Cody Quist makes a motion to adjourn. Tom Gormley seconds the motion. All are in favor.
